Where does HVL fit in the 2010 Census . . .

The population of Dearborn County has grown over the years - from 20,033 in 1920 to 28,874 in 1960. From 38,835 in 1990 to 50,047 in 2010. No surprise here.

Where are the population centers today? Here is the list for 2010.

Now to look ahead and in particular the HVL 2012 elections

First a word about who runs HVL. All of the authority is vested in 5 people called the POA Board. It is given to them by your vote.

Let's think about your vote. In the last 15 years only one year did total votes exceed 25% of eligible voters. That was the year we considered incorporation to become a village, and the percentage was even then less than 30%. This is about on a level with the entire United States in general elections, but it says something about us and our interest in what goes on or is done, or how money is spent in our private community.

At least two conclusions are obvious . . .

One, we are a big enough force in Dearborn County to do some things if we would just vote . . .

Two, while committees are open to you, and the POA Board is listening, if you want to see things change or be different, you need to vote.

Here is the election schedule for 2012.

- February 1, 2012 - Nominations due at the POA.
- February 2012 - Ballots sent to eligible voters.
- March , 2012 - Ballots due in POA office.
- March 22, 2012 - Annual Meeting. Election results revealed.

Now would be a good time to read up on the election rules and regulations, check out the process, and plan to be a participant voter in 2012.
